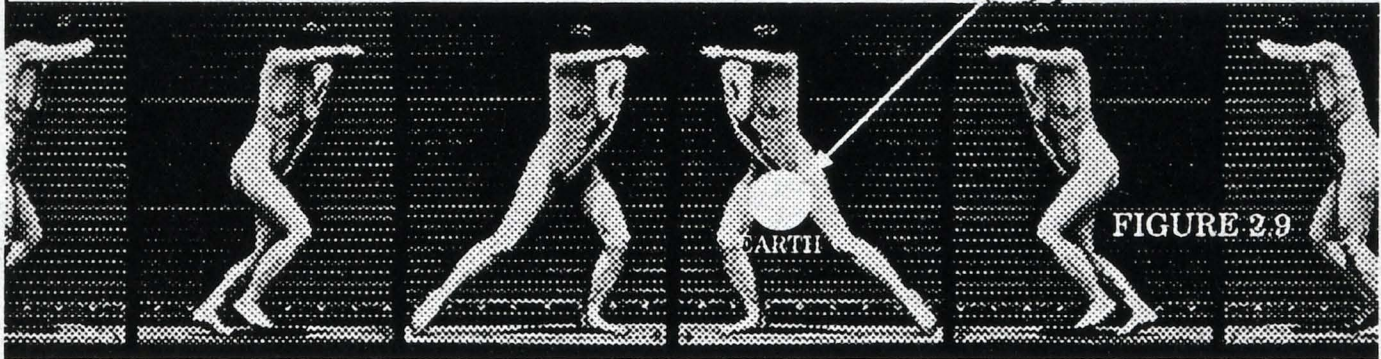
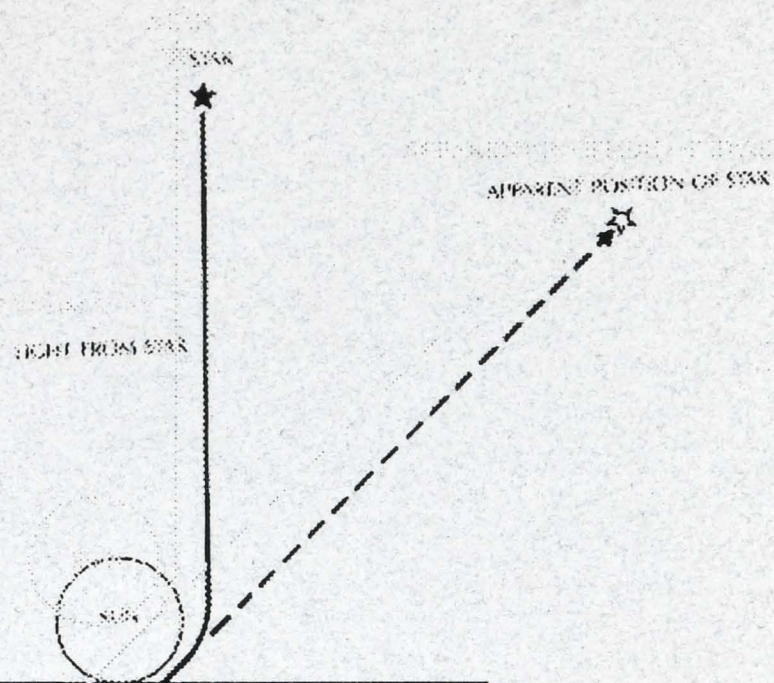


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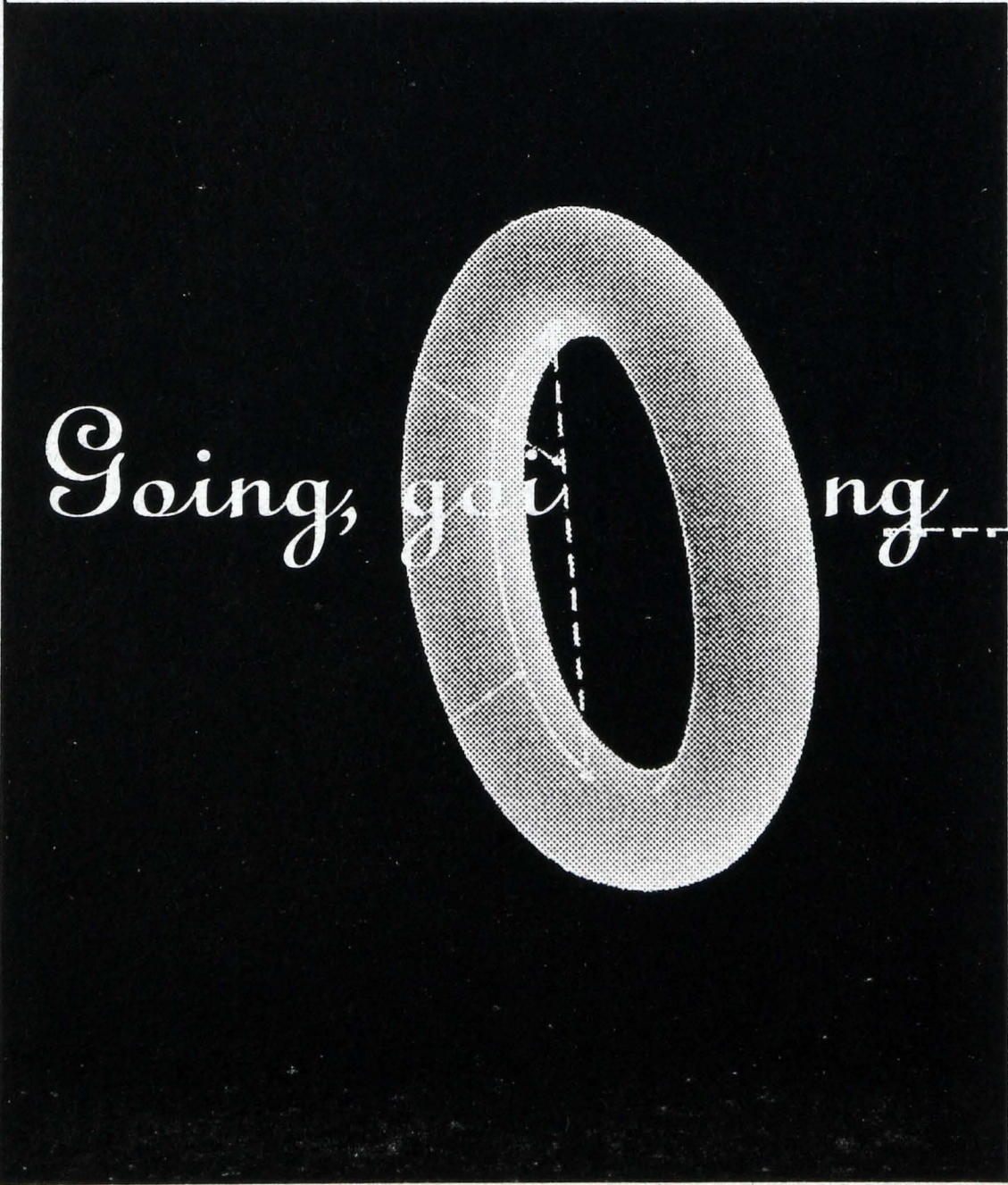

Ellen Lauren - Most recent credits-Anna II in Anne Bogart's production of SEVEN DEADLY SINS at New York City Opera; SITI Company credits include- Julie in MISS JULIE, Electra in ORESTES, Agave in DIONYSUS, THE MEDIUM, GOING, GOING, GONE, as well as conducting classes with the company in New York City and Saratoga over the last 6 years. As a member of the Suzuki Company of Toga (SCOT) under the direction of Tadashi Suzuki, she has toured throughout the world including the premiere performance of the Theatre Olympics in Athens and the NHK filming of DIONYSUS in the Teatro Olimpico in Italy. As a teacher of the Suzuki Actor Training Method for Mr Suzuki and SITI, she teaches both in the US and abroad, most recently returning from Bogota, Colombia. She is currently on the faculties of The Juilliard School of Drama and Columbia University. Additional credits include- Anne Bogart's productions of THE ADDING MACHINE and PICNIC at Actors Theater of Louisville and THE WOMEN at Hartford Stage; 4 years resident company Milwaukee Rep, 2 years Alley Theatre, 6 years StageWest in Massachusetts.

Also of note are: the title role in *HENRY VI, THE MERCHANT OF VENICE, TIS' PITY SHE'S A WHORE*, and *THE TWO PARTS OF HENRY IV*, at The Joseph Papp Public Theater; *ANOTHER PERSON IS A FOREIGN COUNTRY* (Bogart), *MARATHON DANCING* (Bogart), *STRANGE FEET*, and *THE TROJAN WOMEN / A LOVE STORY*, all for NY's En Garde Arts; *THE CRYPTOGRAM*, written and directed by David Mamet; and most recently the premiere of Richard Foreman's *PEARLS FOR PIGS*, which will be coming to San Francisco in the fall of '97. MFA, UC San Diego.

Karenjune Sanchez appeared in SITI's *SMALL LIVES/ BIG DREAMS*. Regional Theatre: *THE TEMPEST, HAMLET, A CHRISTMAS CAROL, HOLIDAY MEMORIES* at Stage West; *JUNO AND THE PAYCOCK, SHE STOOPS TO CONQUER, A CHRISTMAS CAROL* at Milwaukee Repertory; *TWELFTH NIGHT, AS YOU LIKE IT, MACBETH, TRUE WEST* at Actors Shakespeare Company. Anne Bogart is Co-Artistic Director of the Saratoga International Theater Institute (SITI), which she founded with Japanese director Tadashi Suzuki in 1992. She is the recipient of two Obie Awards and a Bessie Award. Ms. Bogart is currently an Associate Professor at Columbia University. Recent productions include: *THE SEVEN DEADLY SINS* by Bertolt Brecht and Kurt Weill (New York City Opera), *MISS JULIE* by August Strindberg (Actors Theatre of Louisville/SITI), *SMALL LIVES/BIGDREAMS, THE MEDIUM, GOING, GOING, GONE* (SITI), *MARATHON DANCING* by Laura Harrington (En Garde Arts), *THE WOMEN* by Claire Booth Luce (Hartford Stage), *HOT N' THROBBING* by Paula Vogel (American Repertory Theatre), Ms. Vogel's *BAL-*

TIMORE WALTZ (Circle Repertory Theatre), and *PICNIC* by William Inge (Actors Theatre of Louisville).

Andrew Kranis has been Production Manager, Assistant Director, Stage Manager, or Japanese/English Interpreter for SITI's New York City, San Francisco, Louisville and European debut productions. He is currently directing "THE BRIDGE DOVE," a new piece for Mabou Mines Suites. He has also directed at New York Theatre Workshop, NYU and Dixon Place.

T.J. Gerckens U.S.A.A. (Lighting Design) is making his Magic Theatre debut with *GOING, GOING, GONE*. His work was recently seen in the Bay Area at the Zellerbach Playhouse with Berkeley Repertory's production of *JOURNEY TO THE WEST*. He also designed the world premiere of *JOURNEY*. . . at Chicago's Goodman Theatre and its subsequent production at Boston's Huntington Theatre Company. Other Goodman Theatre credits include *BLACK STAR LINE, ALL'S WELL THAT ENDS WELL, THE NOTEBOOKS OF LEONARDO DA VINCI*, and *THE PAIN OF THE MACHO*. He also had the pleasure of designing *DA'VINCI* for the Lincoln Center SeriousFun! Festival in New York City. As the Resident Lighting Designer at Actors Theatre of Louisville he designed twenty-two productions over two seasons. His tenure included two years of the Humana Festival of New American Plays, featuring works such as *BELOW THE BELT, CLOUD TECTONICS, JACK AND JILL, ONE FLEA SPARE* and the SITI Company's *GOING, GOING, GONE*. Other credits include Mary Zimmerman's staging of the *MAGIC FLUTE* for Chicago Opera Theatre, and *CYMBELINE* for Chicago's Shakespeare Repertory Theatre (for which he received a Jefferson Award nomination). Mr. Gerckens is an affiliate of the On-Call Faculty Program.

Mame Hunt (Artistic Director, Magic Theatre) In her distinguished career in dramaturgy and new play development, Ms. Hunt has worked with some of the most exciting playwrights in the country, including Thomas Babe, Jon Robin Baitz, Julie Hébert, Quincy Long, Donald Margulies, Heather McDonald, Marlane Meyer, Darrah Cloud, Octavio Solis, Nilo Cruz and Claire Chafee. As Director of New Play Development at the Los Angeles Theatre Center, she was dramaturg for the world premieres of Darrah Cloud's *The Stick Wife* and Marlane Meyer's *Etta Jenks*, and designed and co-produced

LATC's annual New Works Project. Ms. Hunt has also worked on new plays at Berkeley Rep, South Coast Rep, and Victory Gardens. She has been a consultant for the National Endowment for the Arts, the Rockefeller Foundation, the California Arts Council, and the Nordic Theatre Committee in Reykjavik, Iceland.

Jane E. Brown (Managing Director, Magic Theatre) Prior to joining the Magic Theatre last January, Ms. Brown served for five years as Executive Director of the Philadelphia-based modern dance company Karen Bamonte Dance Works. She was the founding Executive Director of the Balanchine-oriented Fort Worth Ballet Company and previous to that was the co-founder of a public relations/special events firm in that same city. During her twenty year tenure in Fort Worth she served as a trustee of most of its major cultural institutions and helped establish a number of public arts projects. She fulfilled appointments to the Texas Commission on the Arts Dance Panel, the Fort Worth Art Commission, Leadership Inc., and the City's Bicentennial Commission. Ms. Brown was raised in Los Angeles and began her career there at the LA County Museum of Art. Before moving to Texas she was a reporter in the Los Angeles bureaus of Time/Life and Newsweek.

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The Saratoga International Theater Institute (SITI) was founded in 1992 by Anne Bogart and Tadashi Suzuki to redefine and revitalize contemporary theatre in the United States through an emphasis on international cultural exchange and collaboration. Originally envisioned as a summer institute in Saratoga Springs NY. SITI has expanded to encompass a year round program based in New York City with a summer season in Saratoga. SITI's three ongoing components are: the creation of new work, training of young theater artists, and a commitment to forming partnerships with international collaborators. Anne Bogart and the SITI Company believe that contemporary American theater must necessarily incorporate artists from around the world, form partnerships, and learn from a cross-cultural exchange of dance, music, art and performance experiences.
