

director's note

We premiered *bobrauschenbergamerica* at the Humana Festival of New American Plays in March of 2001. The towers had not fallen and the United States felt a little bit asleep to me. And then, after 9/11, everything changed. As we began a tour of *bobrauschenbergamerica*, the new context definitely altered the audience's experience of the play. The onstage presence of an American flag as a primary set element suddenly altered the experience of the play. The jokes played differently. The sentiments seemed more charged and the associations more complex.

And now, in 2010, we are presenting *bobrauschenbergamerica* as part of our first New York City season at Dance Theater Workshop's Guest Artist Series. We are curious to discover its present meanings with you. The production is a signature work for SITI Company and we are eager to share it with what we hope will become our hometown audience.

Please let your friends know that this is happening. And please know that we will be back next season, both in the Fall of '10 and the Spring of '11, with more SITI Company creations at Dance Theater Workshop.

SITI Company is an ensemble theater company led by Anne Bogart. Its mission is to:

Originally envisioned as a summer institute in Saratoga Springs, New York, SITI expanded to encompass a year-round company based in New York City with a summer season in Saratoga. The Company is known nationally and internationally as a top-level artistic collective that generates groundbreaking theater while also training artists from around the world.

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

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
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

Going, Going, Gone; Small Lives/Big Dreams; The Medium; Noel Coward's Hay Fever and Private Lives; August Strindberg's Miss Julie; and Charles Mee's Orestes. She is the author of three books: *A Director Prepares, The Viewpoints Book* and *And Then, You Act.*

WILL BOND (ALLEN) is a founding member of SITI Company. He has performed and toured nationally and internationally in SITI's *Orestes* (by company member Charles L. Mee), *The Medium* (Obie award winner), *Small Lives/Big Dreams, Culture of Desire, Bob* (Obies for light and sound and three Drama Desk Nominations including best solo performance of the year), *War of the Worlds, War of the Worlds - The Radio Play, Cabin Pressure, La Dispute, Death and the Ploughman, Lilith and Seven Deadly Sins* (New York City Opera), *Radio Macbeth, Who Do You Think You Are* and *Antigone*. 


