## **Director's note:**

Virginia Woolf wrote with delicacy, humor, anger, outrage, and passion from the point of view of a highly creative woman in the first half of the 20th century. Her issues are still contemporary. *Room* examines these notions from the perspective we now share at the beginning of the 21st century. Sampled from a lifetime of Woolf's writings, *Room* traces the movement of a creative spirit in exquisite crisis. Ellen Lauren portrays an artist in the pressure cooker of articulation. The play is about the room to move, the room to breathe, the room to imagine, emotional room, creative room.

**Virginia Woolf** (25 January 1882 – 28 March 1941) was an English author, essayist, publisher, and writer of short stories, who is regarded as one of the foremost modernist literary figures of the twentieth century. Her most famous works include the novels *Mrs. Dalloway*, *To the Lighthouse*, *The Waves* and *Orlando*, and the book-length essay *A Room of One's Own*, based on lectures she had given at women's colleges at Cambridge University. Virginia married writer Leonard Woolf in 1912, and the two collaborated professionally founding the Hogarth Press in 1917, which subsequently published Virginia's novels along with works by T.S. Eliot, Laurens van der Post, and others. The Press also commissioned works by contemporary artists, including Dora Carrington and Vanessa Bell. Virginia Woolf died on 28 March 1941 when she drowned herself in the River Ouse near her home in Sussex, by putting rocks in her coat pockets.

## COMPANY

SITI Company is an ensemble-based theater company led by Anne Bogart. Its mission is: To create bold new productions; To perform and tour these productions nationally and internationally; To train together consistently; To train theater professionals and students in an approach to acting and collaboration that forges unique and highly disciplined artists for the theater; and, to create opportunities for artistic dialogue and cultural exchange.

Founded in 1992 by Anne Bogart and Tadashi Suzuki, SITI Company began as an agreement to redefine and revitalize contemporary theater in the United States through an emphasis on international cultural exchange and collaboration. Originally envisioned as a summer institute in Saratoga Springs, New York, SITI expanded to encompass a year-round company based in New York City with a summer season in Saratoga. The Company is known nationally and internationally as a top-level artistic collective that generates groundbreaking theater while also training artists from around the world.

In addition to Artistic Director Anne Bogart, SITI Company is comprised of ten actors, four designers, a playwright and an executive director. The company represents a change in thinking about the relationships between artists and institutions. SITI Company has formed relationships with theaters and venues around the world who present the Company's work. Every summer the Company continues to gather for our annual Summer Intensive at Skidmore College in Saratoga Springs, NY.

SITI recently premiered *American Document* with the Martha Graham Dance Company at the Joyce, *Antigone* at Dance Theater Workshop, *Under Construction* at Actors Theatre of Louisville's Humana Festival, Virginia Woolf's only play *Freshwater* at the Women's Project and *Who Do You Think You Are* at Arizona State University. Future works include: *Trojan Women*, *Soot and Spit*, *Empire of Light* and *The Visit*.

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## Biographies

**Anne Bogart** (Director) is the Artistic Director of the SITI Company, which she founded with Japanese director Tadashi Suzuki in 1992. She is a Professor at Columbia University where she runs the Graduate Directing Program. Works with SITI include *American Document*; *Antigone*; *Under Construction*; *Freshwater*; *Who Do You Think You Are*; *Radio Macbeth*; *Hotel Cassiopeia*; *Death and the Ploughman*; *La Dispute*; *Score*; *bobrauschenbergamerica*; *Room*; *War of the Worlds*; *Cabin Pressure*; *The Radio Play*; *Alice's Adventures*; *Culture of Desire*; *Bob*; *Going, Going, Gone*; *Small Lives/Big Dreams*; *The Medium*; Noel Coward's *Hay Fever* and *Private Lives*; August Strindberg's *Miss Julie*; and Charles Mee's *Orestes*. She is the author of three books: *A Director Prepares*, *The Viewpoints Book* and *And Then, You Act*.

**Jocelyn Clarke** (Playwright) is a freelance dramaturg and writer. He is a creative advisor on the Screenwriting program at the National Film School in Ireland, as well as a member of the artistic staff of the Sundance Theatre Lab. He was the Commissioning and Literary Manager of the Abbey Theatre for four years, and lead theatre critic with *The Sunday Tribune* for nine years. He has written four adaptations for Anne Bogart and SITI Company—*Bob*, *Alice's Adventures*, *Room*, and *Score*. He is an Associate Artist with the New York based theatre collective *The Civilians*, and recently collaborated with the company on a new play *Brooklyn at Eye Level*, which premiered in New York last December. His adaptation of Flann O'Brien's *At Swim Two Birds* for the Blue Raincoat Theatre Company will open in Sligo, Ireland, in November.
