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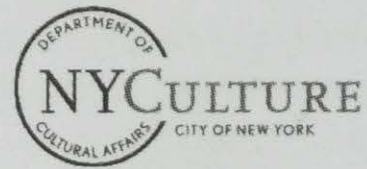
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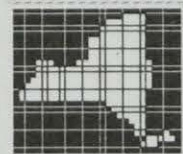

ANNE BOGART (DIRECTOR/CONCEIVER) is the Artistic Director of SITl Company, which she founded with Japanese director Tadashi Suzuki in 1992. She is a Professor at Columbia University where she runs the Graduate Directing Program. Works with SITl include *Trojan Women*, *American Document* (with the Martha Graham Dance Company), *Antigone*; *Under Construction*; *Freshwater*; *Who Do You Think You Are*; *Radio Macbeth*; *Hotel Cassiopeia*; *Death and the Ploughman*; *La Dispute*; *Score*; *bobrauschenbergamerica*; *Room*; *War of the Worlds*; *Cabin Pressure*; *The Radio Play*; *Alice's Adventures*; *Culture of Desire*; *Bob*; *Going, Going, Gone*; *Small Lives/Big Dreams*; *The Medium*; Noel Coward's *Hay Fever* and *Private Lives*; August Strindberg's *Miss Julie*; and Charles Mee's *Orestes*. She is the author of three books: *A Director Prepares*, *The Viewpoints Book* and *And Then, You Act*.

WILL BOND (BOB) is a founding member of SITl Company. He has performed and toured nationally and internationally in SITl's *Orestes* (by company member Charles L. Mee), *The Medium* (Obie award winner), *Small Lives/Big Dreams*, *Culture of Desire*, *Bob* (Obies for light and sound and three Drama Desk Nominations including best solo performance of the year), *War of the Worlds*, *War of the Worlds—The Radio Play*, *Cabin Pressure*, *bobrauschenbergamerica*, *La Dispute*, *Death and the Ploughman*, *Lilith* and *Seven Deadly Sins* (New York City Opera), *Radio Macbeth*, *Who Do You Think You Are* and *Antigone*. He has toured with Tadashi Suzuki and SCOT in *Dionysus* and with Robert Wilson's *Persephone*. Regional works include: *Macbeth*, *The Lover*, *Creditors*, *Mystery of Irma Vep*, *Greater Tuna*, *Night Must Fall*, *The Tempest*, *Hamlet*. He has created original works including *History of the World from the very Beginning* with Christian Frederickson & SITl's Brian Scott, *Crash* (temporary title) a work in progress also with Brian Scott in collaboration with Deborah Hay, *I'll Crane For You* a solo performance dance theater work commissioned from Deborah Hay, and *THE PERFECT HUMAN V1* a 10 minute dance duet with Marianne Kim for the Harlem EMoves Festival. Will is currently Senior Artist-In-Residence at Skidmore College.

JOCELYN CLARKE (ADAPTOR) is a freelance dramaturge and writer. He is a member of the artistic staff of the Sundance Theatre Lab and has taught dramaturgy at the John F. Kennedy Center

in Washington, D.C., and at Columbia University. Clarke is an associate artist with the Civilians and Theater Mitu in New York. He has written six plays for Anne Bogart and SITI Company: *Bob*, *Alice's Adventures*, *Room Score*, *Antigone* and *Trojan Women*. *Here You Are Human*, his new project with the Tiger Lilies, was presented at the Archa Theatre during the Prague Quadrennial last May.

ANNA HAYMAN (DEVELOPMENT OFFICER) Anna is a theater producer and development professional whose credits include: *The Provenance of Beauty* and *Myopia/Plays* for the Foundry Theatre, *Angela's Mixtape* at the Ohio Theater for New Georges & The Hip Hop Theater Festival, *Another Place* with the Anthropologists as part of the HEREstay Artists Residency at HERE, *Havana Bourgeois*, *Ping Pong Diplomacy*, and *Billboard* with Reverie Productions. She has produced plays and events at Bristol Valley Theater, 59E59 Theaters, and CSC, and was the Development Director for TACT/The Actors Company Theatre, the Development Associate for La MaMa's 50th Anniversary Celebrations, and a freelance Development Consultant for Pam Tanowitz, Alexandra Beller/Dances, and others. She holds an MFA in Performing Arts Management from Brooklyn College.

A graduate of Cornell College, he received his MFA from Yale School of Drama.

DAVID ROBERTS (ASSOCIATE PRODUCER) currently serves as Associate Producer for SITI Company, focusing on General Management and Programs. He is also a freelance producer and

Past producing and management credits include *Under Construction*, *Antigone*, *bobrauschenbergamerica*, *American Document*, *Freshwater*, *Radio Macbeth*, and *War of the Worlds – The Radio Play* with SITl Company in New York, and many other SITl productions on tour; Associate Managing Director and Company Manager at Yale Repertory Theatre; line producer for *Sonia Flew* at Summer Play Festival 2006; inaugural Producer's Chair Award recipient, a mentorship program of The Foundry Theatre, for his work as producer on *The Brothers Size*, presented at the Public Theater's 2007 Under the Radar Festival. JAMES SCHUETTE (COSTUME DESIGN) has designed over 15 productions for SITl Company. She has an Arts Administration Certificate from New York University, attended the Executive Program for Non-Profit Leaders at Stanford University Business School, was a member of the Arts Leadership Institute Charter Class at Teachers College, Columbia University and holds a B.A. in Theater from Occidental College in Los Angeles, California. Megan currently serves on the board of Theatre Communications Group (TCG) and is the chair of the Enrichment Committee at the Pearls Hawthorne School. She has been selected along with 99 other executives to participate in the Chief Executive Program sponsored by National Arts Strategies.

DARRON L WEST (SOUNDSCAPE) A SITI Company member since 1993 and first collaborated with Anne Bogart in 1990 while resident sound designer at Actors Theatre of Louisville. His work has been heard in over 500 productions both nationally and internationally. His accolades include a 1998 OBIE award for SITI's *Bob*, a 2000 Princess Grace Award, the Entertainment Design Magazine EDDY for SITI's *bobrauschenbergamerica*, the 2004 and 2005 Henry Hewes Design award, a 2006 Lortell Award and the 2010 Bay Area Critic's Circle Award. Currently represented on Broadway by David Henry Hwang's *Chinglish*.
