

WHAT IS SITI?

SITI, The Saratoga International Theater Institute is an ensemble-based company whose three ongoing components are the creation of new work, the training of young theatre artists, and a commitment to forming partnerships with international collaborators. The SITI company is comprised of director Anne Bogart and ensemble members J. Ed Araiza, Will Bond, Leon Ingulsrud, Ellen Lauren, Kelly Maurer, Jefferson Mays, Tom Nelis, Barney O'Hanlon, Karenjune Sanchez, Stephen Webber, Megan Wanlass, and Darron L. West.

SITI was founded in 1992 by Anne Bogart and Tadashi Suzuki to redefine and revitalize contemporary theater in the United States through an emphasis on international cultural exchange and collaboration. Originally envisioned as a summer institute in Saratoga Springs, New York, SITI has expanded to encompass a year-round program based in New York City with a summer season in Saratoga. SITI believes that contemporary American theater must necessarily incorporate artists from around the world and learn from the resulting cross-cultural exchange of dance, music, art, and performance experiences.

SITI TRAINING

SITI actors teach the Viewpoints and the Suzuki Method of Actor Training. SITI conducts spring and fall sessions of training in New York City. In 1996, SITI will conduct two summer training sessions, one at Skidmore College (Saratoga Springs, NY) and another at Emory University (Atlanta, GA) in conjunction with the Olympic Games. The company is also available for workshops or residencies at university theater departments around the country.

The Viewpoints

The Viewpoints grew out of the post-modern dance world as a way of creating a structure for movement improvisation. Anne Bogart has adapted the Viewpoints and has expanded them for the theater to create bold and innovative new works. Through the physical application of the Viewpoints, participants acquire an understanding of this unique vocabulary while aggressively exploring the boundaries of dance, music, and theater.

The Suzuki Actor Training Method

The Suzuki Method is a rigorous, physical discipline for actors created by world-renowned theater artist Tadashi Suzuki. Designed to regain the perceptive, expressive abilities and powers of the human body, the method strives to restore the wholeness of the body in a theatrical context. By drawing on traditional forms the training seeks "to create something transcending current practice in the modern theater."
