- *American Document*: Because this exciting collaboration between the SITI Company and the Martha Graham Company will actually be opening at the Joyce in June, I have been told very sternly that I must not review it. Fine. Instead, I will simply tell you that you ought to go and see this workshop version of the project—an expansion and reimagining of Graham's 1938 dance-theater hybrid—because presiding intellect Anne Bogart allows the audience so thoroughly into her process. She presents the videos and archival jottings that inspired the combined companies; we hear how Charles Mee assembled a new collage of American texts; we see portions of yet unfinished dances. Please notice that I am not telling you if the results are good or bad (this is not a review! not!), but anyone interested in either of these two American titans would do well to see this work at such an illuminating developmental stage.
