





Cage and chess are reunited in this new play conceived and directed by Anne Bogart for SITI Company. Over the course of ninety minutes, a couple (Will Bond and Ellen Lauren) play the game while having a conversation adapted by Jocelyn Clarke from Cage's lectures, interviews, and other acts of public speaking. Never boring, Cage's often surprising insights on music and everyday life bear the imprint of an artist listening closely to the world around him.
